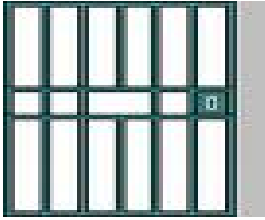

INTRODUCTION

- What do you think of the proverb: “Sticks and stones may break my bones but words cannot harm me?”
- In this Psalm of lament the psalmist is:
 - Entering his Plea to God
 - Explaining his Problem to God
 - Emphasizing the Plan of God &
 - Encouraging Praises to God

INVESTIGATION

- Verses 1-2 - The Psalmist's Cry to God for Shelter
- Verses 3-6 - The Psalmist's Complaint to God over the Schemes of the ungodly
 - Verses 3&4 > their attacks
 - Verses 5&6> their agreement
- Verses 7-9 - The Psalmist's Confidence that God will Step In
- Verse 10 - The Psalmist's Celebration of God who is a Savior



IMPLICATION

God's desire is that:

- We make our Requests known to Him
- We make our Racing Hearts known to Him
- We make our Reassurance in Him known
- We make our Rejoicing in Him known
